





Asia Telemedicine Symposium

Date : 2007.12.7 (Fri) - 8 (Sat)

The symposium aims to systematically spread the new "transport system of medical moving images," which utilize high-level IT technology and have been developed and field-tested, between Japan and Korea throughout all of Asia. This system will be used to address the disparities in medical care within Asia and new medical issues related to infection and natural disaster. By regularly and correctly sharing advanced medical techniques within the Asian area, where there is no problem of time differences, it is possible to activate international medical cooperation at general healthcare practitioners and the citizen-level, remote medical services, and medical education. Through the symposium participants seek to achieve a standardization of medical care in Asia and the worldwide establishment of this system.

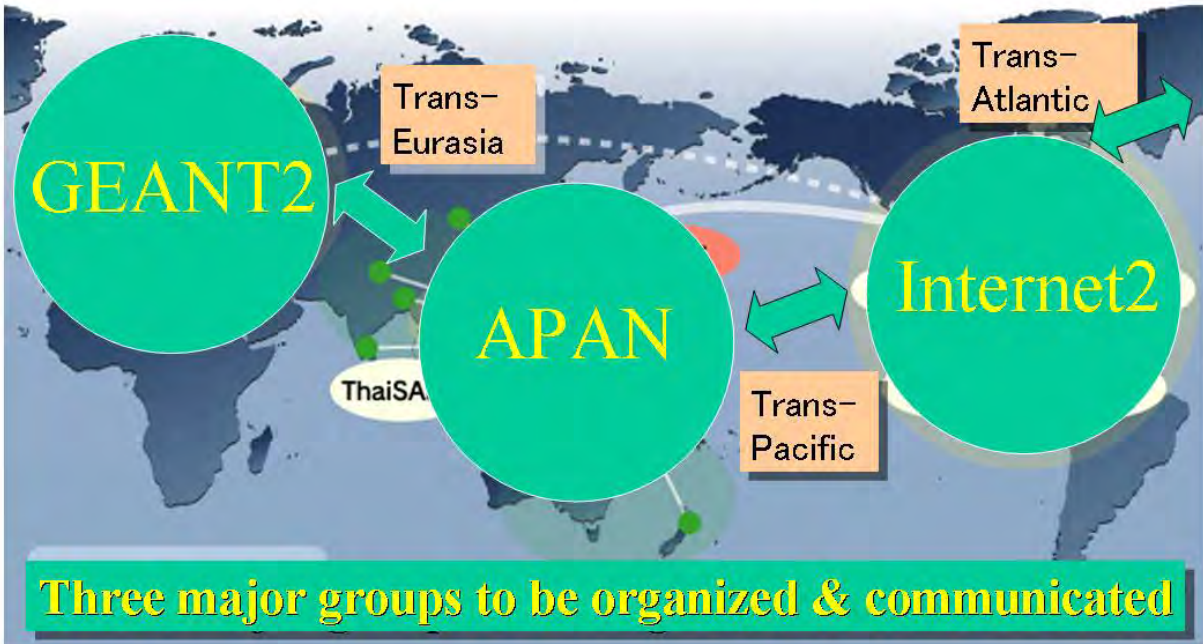
