Wittgenstein and Keynes had met before the First World War and continued to communicate through the war. In this correspondence, Keynes reports his experience in trying to understand the *Tractatus*, which he calls 'a work of extraordinary importance.' 'Right or wrong, it dominates all fundamental discussions at Cambridge since it was written. The *post scriptum* reads: 'I would do anything in my power which could make it easier for you to do further work.' Keynes writes of sending Wittgenstein four of his books: 'Probability is the completion of what I was doing before the war. I fear you will not like it. Two on the Peace Treaty, half economic and half political, a book on Monetary Reform (which is what I most think about now)'. He also tries to persuade Wittgenstein to come to Cambridge.

In his second letter, Keynes expresses his regret that Wittgenstein has not yet visited him in Cambridge, and invites him to Sussex instead. Keynes tries once again to entice him to visit with promises that Wittgenstein 'could work too, - and at any rate be just as morose as you might feel inclined, without upsetting anybody. Perhaps sometime under such conditions you will come?'

In his draft letter, Wittgenstein thanks Keynes for some books and a letter, and explains why he is replying so late and why in English: '... writing in German makes things easy for me and difficult for you. On the other hand if I write in English I am afraid the whole business may become hopeless at MY end already...'. Wittgenstein is reluctant to acquiesce to Keynes' desire that he come to Cambridge. He candidly states, '... of course staying in Cambridge with you is much nicer than staying in Vienna alone. But in Vienna I can collect my thoughts a little and although they are not worth collecting they are better than mere distraction. Now it wouldn't seem impossible that I could get more out of you than a cup of tea every other day that's to say I could really profit from hearing you and talking to you and in this case it would be worth while coming over. But here again there are great difficulties: We haven't met since 11 years. I don't know if you have changed during that time but I certainly have, tremendously. I am sorry to say that I am no

better than I was, but I am *different*. And therefore if we shall meet you may find that the man who has come to see you isn't the one you meant to invite...'

ヴァイトゲンシュタインの著書『論理学』(Tractatus)を理解しようとしての読後感を述べ、自身の4つの著作(『確率論』、2つのベルサイユ和平に関する著作、『貨幣改革論』)について触れています。次の書簡ではヴァイトゲンシュタインをケンブリッジに呼ぼうと強力に説得しています。

別の友人ラムジー宛書簡の裏面に書かれた草稿。ケインズへの返事が遅れた理由について、英語で書くことの煩わしさが原因であるといっています。また、ケインズの熱心な説得にもかかわらず、ウィーンを離れてケンブリッジに赴くことに難色を示しています。

At the beginning of this (and the following) letter, Keynes notes the does of arsenic and thyroid taken, the amount of urine he is producing and his daily temperature at 9am, 6pm and 9pm. He then reports on his general condition, activities that day, and his own interpretation of the information. His attention to detail is typical of his interest in recording statistical data.

'I enjoy my bath. I broke my constipation today and had a fairly complete natural evacuation, but it was one of the stiffest jobs I have ever accomplished! I am getting out a good deal and chest sensations very satisfactory. No heart pains whatever. Mouth rather dry; head sometimes a little fuzzy; occasionally very slight nausea. Nerves not too good, but sleep very fair. Nerves undoubtedly affected by worry over news in the newspapers... I took enough exercise yesterday to give me stiff muscles today which is very good. I walked over a mile this morning, without a rest and without wanting one. I no longer have any desire for frequent rests as I had before'.

Maynard Keynes had suffered from heart strain since complications following an appendicitis in 1915. In the summer of 1937 he became gravely ill with thrombosis of a coronary artery and left Cambridge to recover at Ruthin Castle, Wales, supervised by some of Britain's best physicians. Besides the coronary disease it was observed that he was suffering from severe bacterial infection of the tonsils. The six month recovery that was promised did not materialise and he lost faith in London's 'established' medical profession. 'How Keynes got to hear of Plesch is unrecorded. But Plesch's entry into his life was a decisive turning point in his illness. For "undoubtedly it was he, and he alone, who brought me back into active life"' (Skidelsky).

In the first letter Harrod writes to introduce himself; *'I am writing the life of Maynard Keynes at the request of his family with access to all his private papers. I wonder if you would be so very kind as to give me guidance on what I ought to say about his illness. Might I come and see you some time?'*

Having clearly been granted access to the Doctor's notes, Harrod notes *'The two extracts that I propose to quote do not contain matter specifically bearing upon your capacity as medical advisor, in the sense that he might have written them to any intimate friend. Indeed the one about the Blitz and his health might have been written to an acquaintance ... I have not yet come to writing about the pre-war period of his illness. I may have some difficulty in describing that and again seek to trespass on your time.'*

As his writing progressed, Harrod would send further enquiries of the doctor; *'Was his heart seriously affected for the worse by the loan negotiation? You probably saw him between his return in December 1945 and his departure for Savannah in February 1946, would you say that the strain of the loan negotiation had very seriously affected him, compared with his previous condition? ... Savannah was short, not very arduous, but completely frustrating, and, from his point of view a failure and a disaster.'*

Upon learning of a newly discovered bundle of letters, Harrod writes; *'I have now finished the Life and am reading proofs. I cannot make many changes, but am, of course, still most anxious not to miss any point of first rate importance ... I should be particularly interested if you have any letters written during the last year.'*

The final letters arrange for the safe return of the correspondence and acknowledge the Doctor's remarks upon the published biography: *'I was most pleased indeed to receive your congratulations and to learn that you liked the book ... I should be glad to learn from you if you would like me to deliver the letters by hand to Miss Struben after my return to Oxford.'* The letters were returned on 23 October 1951.

Roy Harrod (1900-1978) was commissioned by Sir Geoffrey Keynes to write the 'official' biography of John Maynard Keynes following Keynes' death in 1946. He started work in 1947. 'It was a labour of love, passion and projection, researched and written in an astonishingly short time' (Skidelsky). As part of his research, he corresponded with Dr. Plesch.

Replying to Harrod's enquiry, in the first letter Plesch writes that *'Lady Lydia has told me a lot about you. Nothing more natural than to put everything I know about Lord Keynes at your disposal.'*

In answer to Harrod's enquiries about Keynes' heart, Plesch explains *'I have to draw your attention to the distinction between work and performance. For the normal work Keynes' heart was efficient but for a sudden emotional performance inefficient ... I did see him, of course ...'*

but as I told you, I kept him away from all emotional strain as a President of the Art Council and sat with him alone in a corner in order to keep people away who could exhaust him ... Mental strain never effected him, but personally he was very sensible and emotional.'

Having been sorting out his correspondence, Plesch writes announcing the discovery of more correspondence; *'I don't know whether you need them, but if so, they are at your disposal.'* Further to a positive reply from Harrod, *'I am sending you all that I have found. Please, after perusal, will you return them together with the other letters I gave you.'*

The final letter, written by Plesch's secretary, advises Harrod that the doctor is in Italy *'in order to benefit from the warm climate there'* and notes *'for returning the documents in question I would suggest ... that you use my above address where they will be safely kept until Professor Plesch's return.'*

'Keynes came to regard Janos Plesch as "something between a genius and a quack" ... It says much for Keynes's intuition that he was willing to entrust himself to this very unEnglish medical practitioner... Janos Plesch, then aged sixty, was a self-made Hungarian Jew, who had established a fashionable medical practice in Berlin in 1910 ...' (Skidelsky, *John Maynard Keynes*, Vol. 3, p. 40).

In 1948, two years after Keynes' death, Lydia writes, presumably in answer to a letter from Plesch, *'How can I forget you? But I find London depressing, prefer to stay here more than I used to. So please, forgive me if I do not come to you ... When I am in London may I ring you up, till then au-revoir.'*

The postcards, featuring female portraits, send belated New Year wishes: *'I am sorry I am late with my last New Year's wishes, but I always remember you with great affection ... I enjoy life and see Maynard's mother every day.'* *'I am so grieved to hear of your severe symptoms. My fond love indeed. I think you have passed through the worse, and now I drink your health for your recovery ... P.S. I hope Susanna [the subject of the postcard] will make you smile – isn't she divine?'*

Lydia and Maynard often affectionately referred to Plesch in correspondence and conversation as "the benevolent ogre", frequently omitting the adjective.

The topics covered in the papers read ranged from the 'League of Nations and the Rehabilitation of Europe', by Cecil, to the 'Regulation of Wages' by Hobhouse along with an important paper on 'Reparations and Inter-Allied Debt' by Keynes.
