

The 8th Asia Telemedicine Symposium was co-organized by National University Hospital Council of Japan.




Appointed doctors and engineers in each university hospital participated in the 2nd general meeting.




The first teleconference by Director/Dean of top Asian hospitals was organized during 8th ATS.




Using H.323 systems, 28 national university hospitals were connected for technical discussion.



The first live demonstration was organized at JGES87, connecting 13 key medical centers.




The first international session was held in its congress history, transmitting electroencephalogram and involuntary movement.




The first international teleconferences were organized in 3 sessions in JPS45.

The first live endoscopy from Japan to Mexico was successfully organized at AMG2014.




The 19 local hospitals in the region have monthly teleconference for pediatric cancer project.
