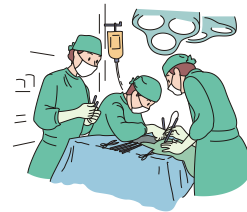

- IP sec protocol is used to protect patient privacy, using VPN router (Allied Telesis).
- A DVTS set and a router will be sent to Pramongkutklao for temporal use.
- Uni-directional microphone with on-off switch or mixer is essential to avoid echo.
- Flat monitor is preferable to have better quality of image.
- Check again with instruments necessary for DVTS set-up at all stations.
